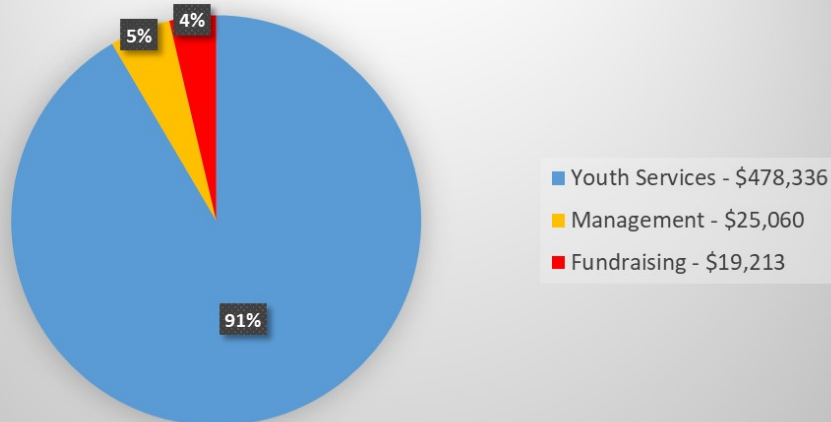

Highlights

·We were awarded \$20,000 from GiveWell Community Foundation for this year's Impact Polk grant. Funds will be used to expand our camping & outdoor recreation programming.

·We were awarded \$2,000 from GiveWell Community Foundation for this year's Empower Polk grant. Funds are allocated for a PA system and a staff retreat.

·Iron Horse Family Foundation granted us \$12,000 towards the purchase of our new van.

·United Way provided \$60,641 for our Childhood program and \$55,044 for our Teen program. Because of their continued support this past year Camp Fire was able to touch over 600 under-served children from 5 to 18!
